One of our recent contributors is Mr. Simon McMahon, who lived in the parish on Webster Avenue many years ago. Mr. McMahon was present when the first parochial school building, built in 1890, was dedicated. He remembers that the sermon was preached by the Rev. F. V. Nugent, C.M. We thank Mr. McMahon for his donation to St. Vincent's school.

Mr. John Foy of Altgeld Street came in with his donation some days ago. Mr. Foy has been in the parish since 1893, living for a time on Osgood Street. He is numbered among the most loyal parishioners, genial and generous. His contribution is made in memory of his departed wife, Mary Stanton Foy.

The children of St. Vincent's school have decided to help us to reach our quota. The eighth grade boys were the first to come forward with their twenty dollars; next came the little girls of the first grade. Other rooms will soon be heard from. They are anxious to have one of the pretty certificates to hang in their rooms as an evidence of good will and good work.

Mr. and Mrs. John F. O'Connell of Clifton Avenue have kindly sent us the usual twenty dollars. Mr. O'Connell is a well known lawyer who will probably again be judge if the political tide turns. One of his brothers is the Rev. Michael O'Connell, C.M., who is now promoting the Miraculous Medal Association at St. Mary's Seminary, Perryville. His good mother lives on Racine Avenue. Three little children bless the O'Connell home, one of whom is old enough to be at St. Vincent's school.

The name of Rev. William J. Gorrell, C.M., has been placed on our honor list through the efforts of one who is a member of St. Ann's Sodality and of the Altar Society and who is also a promoter in the League of the Sacred Heart. Father Gorrell

is the earnest and zealous director of St. Ann's Sodality and of the Holy Name Society. It is a pleasure to put his name on our list.

Two other names of priests have been added by reason of the concert of January 11th, the Rev. Thomas J. Weldon, C.M., and the Rev. John W. Downing, C.M. Father Weldon was here working actively in the parish when the St. Vincent's College opened in 1898. He gave the first professors a hearty welcome. For many years he has been in New Orleans.

Rev. John W. Downing, C.M., passed away on Christmas Day, 1915, just ten years ago. His memory is still fresh in the minds of many, being remembered as the director of St. Ann's Sodality and one interested in St. Vincent's school. Among other things, he bought the cottage to the north and a lot to the south of the school with contributions gathered quietly from the people.

Among our recent contributors should be mentioned Mr. and Mrs. John Schmitz of Seminary Avenue, a young couple who have lived in the parish about three years. Mrs. Schmitz is evidently Irish, formerly living in St. Andrew's parish. A little girl completes the family.

Mr. John K. Dwyer has given another contribution, this time in memory of his mother, Mary Finn Dwyer. The Dwyers were here from the beginning of the parish and rejoiced when announcement of the building of the first church was made by Father Smith, who was then celebrating Mass at St. Joseph's hospital.

Mr. Thomas J. Donegan has come forward with two contributions, one in his own name and the other to the memory of his mother, Ann Donegan, and her sister, Mary McLane. These latter died about eighteen years ago, being buried together. For many years the Donegans lived on Sheffield Avenue opposite the De Paul campus. Mr. Donegan is well known as a good contributor in the parish and a memher of the Holy Name Society, the Knights of Columbus and so forth. We thank him for assisting us in this undertaking for St. Vincent's school.

He remembers well when Father Guedry. C.M., built the school in 1890.

Among the oldtime families may be mentioned the McKeons of Webster Avenue. We have just received three contributions from them - one from Margaret, one from Katherine J. and one from Thomas J. McKeon. Thirty years ago they came from Immaculate Conception parish. Their mother died fifteen years ago and was buried from St. Vincent's. Margaret and Katherine are school teachers, while Thomas is a member of Typographical Union No. 16 and belongs to the Foresters. Katherine is a faithful worker at St. Philip's Sunday School. They all love St. Vincent's.

Mr. and Mrs. James Kilroy of Osgood Street have given us the usual twenty dollars for our fund. They have been married about ten years, Mrs. Kilroy being a member of St. Ann's Sodality and a promoter in the League of the Sacred Heart. Mr. Kilroy is a faithful and enthusiastic member of the Holy Name Society and is pleased to aid us in this effort for St. Vincent's school. Mrs. Kilroy desires the contribution to be to the memory of Patrick and Sarah Martin, her parents, who were attending Mass at St. Joseph's hospital when Father Smith made formal announcement of the building of the first church.
